ABOUT THE SHOW

...too often the empathetic storytelling, memory sharing, and sincere display of appreciation is left to a time when the person is no longer earthside to participate in the understanding of their life through the eyes of loved ones. For Holly Treddenick, Artistic Director of Femmes du Feu Creations, a not-for-profit arts organization, and co-owner of The Bank Art House in Welland, Ontario In the Fire is the opportunity to capture stories from her Father's experience as a Firefighter, with his input.

The performance intends to share an understanding of firefighting with a wider audience - to appreciate and understand the work they offer - but also pay tribute to the influence Treddenick's Father has had in her life.

Through the creation of set pieces, aerial dance, inventive apparatuses, a choir (Opus 8 from Toronto), and projection, In the Fire captures, re-interprets and shares important stories from Treddenick's father, who is also the last living founder of the Winnipeg Firefighter Museum. During the 60 minute performance, all are invited into a reflective space to witness the evolution of a father/daughter relationship, to stir a sense of hopefulness in their own lives, and "light the fire".

In the Fire was first embodied by Treddenick in 2018 as part of the Catalyst Program through CAFT, and has grown and developed in its storytelling and innovative use of aerial arts to become the show it is today. It has been generously supported by the Toronto Arts Council, Ontario Arts Council, Canada Council for the Arts, Theatre Gargantua, MICC Commissioning Group at THOH and Peak Performances at Montclair State University. While some dark moments of the show may not be suitable for younger audiences, In the Fire invites community members, families (teenage children and up), and any person who has an intersection with rescue workers or with fire to share a welcoming, accessible, transformative space and hear the stories of Treddenick's Father to celebrate his life - and the lives of all seniors and the stories and lessons they hold - **while they are still here.**

PROGRAM

- Show Length: approx. 60 min
- Max # shows/ day: 2
- Set up Time: 240 min- 4 hours (space dependentload in, rigging)
- Strike Time: 75 min (space dependent)
- Pre show activity: 1 hour in lobby

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

STAGE

LOBBY

- Floor should be clean and free of hazards as performer is barefoot
- Minimum stage size of 20 feet x 24 feet

STAGE APPARATUSES

- Hose rigged like silks single point on swivel
- Rope Loop single point on swivel
- Turn-Out coat single point on swivel
- · Ladder free standing
- Backdrop created from fire hose on a pipe - not human weight bearing, hung from grid
- Various items on stage
- Fire helmet
- Fire boots
- Box with items

- A 50 ft bunting is hung throughout the lobby for audience to view and engage with pre-show
- Various antique fire hall items are displayed

RIGGING

- Rigging points to support 1000 Ibs human load
- Hose rigged like silks single point on swivel, rigging point at 17-18 ft
- Rope Loop single point on swivel, rigging point at 11 ft
- Turn-Out coat single point on swivel, rigging point at 6 ft
- Hose Backdrop 2 points at ends of the pipe, rigging points at 15 ft
- Projector can be flown or on the ground as available

ACCESSIBILITY

LIGHTING

The original design was created in a festival setting and could be recreated using a festival plot with a few added specials for the hanging apparatus. Ideally, the festival plot would include a dance kit (shins and mids)

AUDIO & VIDEO

- Appropriate sound system and speakers to fill the theatre
- Sound is pre-recorded playback from our laptop
- Projector, front projector onto backdrop, minimum 6K brightness HD HDMI input available for provided laptop, area to fill min 6' x 8'
- Audio inputs for sound track and 1/2' audio input for a live phone call as part of the performance

Femmes du Feu Creations is interested in working with you to offer accessibility tools to accompany our presentations. We would like to encourage you to offer audio description and outreach to blind and low vision, Deaf and hard of hearing and Special needs communities. If you have any accessibility resources for your venue, we would like to include this on our website, such a visual story about the space.
